

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HAMILTON, MISSOURI ACCEPTING THE RESULTS OF THE APRIL 5, 2016 ELECTION.**

**WHEREAS**, on November 11, 2015, the Hamilton Board of Aldermen passed Ordinance No. 1586 providing for submission of a proposal to extend the current sales tax for the purpose of funding of capital improvements for maintaining public streets and sidewalks to be placed on the April 5, 2016, ballot.

**WHEREAS**, notice of the election was given by the election authority in accordance with the statutes of the State of Missouri and the Ordinances of the City of Hamilton, Missouri, and such notice published did specify the date and time of the election; and

**WHEREAS**, the election results have been certified by Beverly Bryant, the Caldwell County Clerk;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF HAMILTON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** It is hereby found and declared that the vote at the election held in the City of Hamilton, Missouri on Tuesday, April 5, 2016, on the following proposition resulted as follows:

**PROPOSITION**

Shall the municipality of Hamilton, Missouri extend the current sales tax of one-half cent for the purpose of funding capital improvements (for the purpose of constructing, repairing, and maintaining public streets and sidewalks but no part of such funds will be used for street department personnel expenses) which may include the retirement of debt under previously authorized bonded indebtedness? This sales tax shall terminate on March 31, 2027 unless extended by the voters.



**Section 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.


**Section 4.** If any clause, word, paragraph, section or other part or portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, or unconstitutional for any reason, the Board of Aldermen hereby declares it would nevertheless have enacted the remaining portions thereof, and such remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.


**Section 5.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.




**SECTION 4:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its date of passage.
